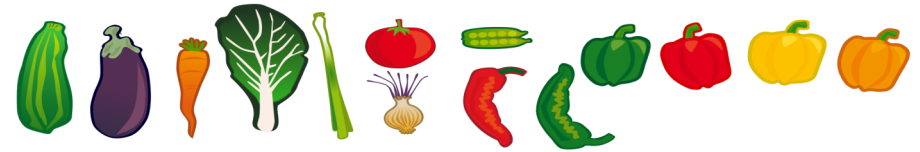

COMPETITION RULES AND ENTRY FORM



1. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and must have been grown or produced within the Parish boundary of Woolavington or have been made by them between 1st September 2025 and the date of the show.
2. Exhibitors may enter multiple varieties of vegetables, fruit and flowers in classes 1—21. Only one item may be entered in classes 22—44. The number of entries must be recorded on the Entry Form. Additional entry forms may be downloaded from the village hall website or photo-copied.
3. Children's exhibits must be by their own hands. The child's age must be recorded on the entry form.
4. Vases and dishes for all classes must be supplied by exhibitors. You are advised not to use expensive containers.
5. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to exhibits.
6. All non-edible exhibits must be recovered by exhibitors at the end of the show. Edible exhibits which have been tasted by the judges and which are not collected will be sold off.
7. Fruit and Vegetable exhibitors must recover produce they wish to keep before 1.30p.m. or it will be sold off or donated to the food bank.
8. All exhibits and entry forms must be delivered, registered and staged at the Belcher Room between 9a.m. and 11a.m. on the day of the show. The Main Hall will be closed for judging between 11.a.m. and 12noon. Exhibitors may collect their items from 1.p.m. until 1.30p.m.



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. There is an entry fee of 30p per item.
2. Exhibitors may pre-register their entries by completing the entry form and submitting it, along with appropriate entry fees, in a sealed envelope through the letterbox at either: 'Greystones', 16a Lower Road or 4 Southfield Close.
3. For classes 1—21, the winner will receive a cup with no monetary prize, 2nd will receive £1 and 3rd will receive 50p. Cups will be awarded following the auction.
4. Monetary prizes will be awarded for 1st (£2), 2nd (£1) and 3rd (50p) places in classes 22—36. Children's classes 37—44 will receive cash prizes— 1st (£10), 2nd (£7.50) and third (£5).
5. A trophy will be awarded to the person achieving the highest number of places in each of the following classes:
 - Fruit and Vegetables
 - Flowers
 - Bakes, Cakes, Jams and Preserves
 - Arts, Crafts and Photography
 - Children's
6. Any non-perishable items not collected at the end of the show will be stored by the committee for 10 days and exhibitors will be responsible for making arrangements for collection.
7. The Albert Hector Cup will also be presented to the best allotment in the village for 2026.
